TEAM NOTES

DAN MUSE NAMED PENGUINS 23RD HEAD COACH

Dan Muse was named the Head Coach of the Pittsburgh Penguins on June 4, 2025. Muse has 20 years of coaching experience in various levels and leagues. He has spent five years as an assistant coach in the NHL with the New York Rangers (2023-25), bringing the team to the Conference Final and the Nashville Predators (2017-20), winning two divisional titles in 2017-18 and '18-19 with Muse as assistant coach.

The Canton, Massachusetts native served as head coach for the US Under-18 Team in 2021 and 2023, winning gold in the '23 championship. He spent three years as head coach for the US National Development Team (2020-23). Muse completed two seasons as head coach for the Chicago Steel of the United States Hockey League (USHL) from 2015-17, leading the team to the championship in the 2016-17 season, winning the Clark Cup.

He spent six seasons at Yale University as an assistant coach (2009-14) and associate head coach (2014-15), the team winning the NCAA Frozen Four Championship with Muse's help in the 2012-13 season.

Before coaching, he played four seasons with Stonehill College (2001-05) and served as an alternate captain in the 2004-05 season.

PIT VS CBJ RECAP (09.24.25)

Pittsburgh fell to Columbus, 4-1, in their second preseason game of the year. **Zach Gallant** found the back of the net in his first exhibition game of the year with an assist going to **Ville Koivunen**. **Artus Silovs** got the start in net, turning aside 12 of 14 shots before giving way to **Filip Larsson** who stopped eight of nine shots in relief.

The loss moves the Penguins to 0-1-1 in the preseason.

PIT VS MTL RECAP (09.22.25)

The Penguins lost 2-1 in a shootout in the Bell Centre against the Montreal Canadiens in their opening game of the preseason on Monday, Sept. 22. **Tristan Broz** opened the scoring with a power-play goal after a nice touch-pass play with **Harrison Brunicke** and **Valterri Puustinen**. Montreal would score one to tie it in the third and the game had to be decided in a shootout. **Joel Blomqvist** started the game in goal stopping all 11 shots he faced, and **Sergei Murashov** stopped 20 of 21 shots (.952 SV%) in relief.

DEFENSEMEN BATTLING FOR SPOTS IN CAMP

The Penguins will have 13 defensemen at training camp who have NHL games under their belt. It will include some familiar faces like **Kris Letang** and **Erik Karlsson** and some new ones like **Matt Dumba**, **Parker Wotherspoon** and **Connor Clifton**.

Dumba has played in 13 seasons in the NHL between the Minnesota Wild, Arizona Coyotes, Tampa Bay Lightning and Dallas Stars. He recorded 10 points (1G-9A) in 63 games with Dallas last season. He's tallied 20-points in seven out of 13 seasons in the NHL in his career. He had a career high in goals (14), assists (36) and points (50) in the 2017-18 season with Minnesota.

Wotherspoon spent his 2024-25 season with the Boston Bruins registering seven points (1G-6A) in 55 games. He has completed parts of three seasons in the NHL with the New York Islanders and Boston Bruins, playing in 108 career games and recorded one goal and 15 assists for 16 points.

Clifton has played in seven NHL seasons between the Boston Bruins and Buffalo Sabres. He registered 16 points (1G-15A) in 73 games. The 5-foot-11, 192-pound defenseman led the Sabres in hits (208) and ranked sixth among NHL defensemen in the 2024-25 season. He hit the 20-point mark once with Boston in the 2022-23 season.

Alexander Alexeyev has played parts of four seasons with the Washington Capitals, earning eight points [1G-7A] in 80 games. In the 2024-25 season, he skated in eight games with the Capitals and three games with the Hershey Bears of the American Hockey League [AHL] where he tallied three assists. He also played in 10 Stanley Cup playoff games with Washington. In over five seasons with the Hershey Bears [AHL], he has played in 145 career games and recorded 52 points [6G-46A].

Ryan Shea has played two seasons in the Penguins organization. In the 2024-25 season, he played in 39 games and recorded five points [2G-3A]. He spent four seasons in the American Hockey League between the Texas Stars and Wilkes-Barre/Scranton registering 72 points [12G-60A] in 186 career games. Shea earned a career-high in assists [29] and points [32] with the Texas Stars in the 2021-22 season.

Caleb Jones spent the 2024-25 season between the Los Angeles Kings and the Ontario Reign of the American Hockey League [AHL]. He played in 44 AHL games and totaled 21 points [2G-19A], ranking third in points [21] among Reign defensemen. He also skated in six games with Los Angeles.

Harrison Brunicke made his professional debut with the Wilkes-Barre/Scranton and played in his fourth season with the Kamloops Blazers of the Western Hockey League [WHL]. He served as an alternate captain of the Blazers. He played in 10 games with WBS and notched two assists. In the postseason, he scored one goal and one assist. With the Kamloops Blazers, Brunicke registered 30 points [5G-25A] in 41 games, leading team defensemen in goals, assists and points.

Owen Pickering suited up for 25 games and recorded three points [1G-2A] with the Penguins while splitting his season with Wilkes-Barre/Scranton in 2024-25. With WBS, Pickering played in 47 games, and registered 13 points [2G-11A], which ranked sixth in assists and points among team defensemen.

Jack St. Ivany spent the 2024-25 season in Pittsburgh and in Wilkes-Barre/Scranton. He tallied one assist in 19 games with Pittsburgh and recorded 16 points [1G-15A] with WBS. Across his career with WBS, he has registered five goals, 34 assists for 39 total points in 154 career games.

Sebastian Aho completed his first season with the Wilkes-Barre/Scranton Penguins in 2024-25, recording 14 assists in 27 games. Over his six seasons in the AHL split between Bridgeport Sound Tigers and WBS he has registered 119 points [21G-98A] in 183 career games. He spent four seasons with the New York Islanders recording 50 points [11G-39A] in 190 games and hitting the 20-point mark once in the 2022-23 season.

NEW FORWARDS

The Penguins bolstered their forward group during the offseason, adding some new and familiar players to their ranks. **Filip Hallander** returns to Pittsburgh after playing in a very productive season in his homeland of Sweden. The Penguins have also added NHL veteran **Anthony Mantha** and **Justin Brazeau**.

Mantha has played 10 seasons in the NHL between the Detroit Red Wings, Washington Capitals, Vegas Golden Knights and Calgary Flames. Over his 10 seasons he has 303 points [146G-157A] in 507 career games. Last season Mantha played in 13 games and registered seven points [4G-3A], until a season ending injury cut his season short. He eclipsed the 20-goal plateau in three seasons throughout his career. He reached a career high in points [48] two seasons in a row with Detroit in the 2017-18 and '18-19.

Brazeau split the 2024-25 season between the Boston Bruins and the Minnesota Wild, recording 22 points [11G-11A] in 76 games. In his NHL career, he has totaled 29 points [16G-13A] in 95 games. Brazeau ranked seventh in goals [10] on the Bruins last season.

Hallander has split his professional career with the Swedish Hockey League (SHL), the American Hockey League (AHL) and NHL. He spent his 2024-25 season with Timrå IK (SHL) registering 53 points (26G-27A) in 51 games. He led the team in goals and points and ranked second in assists. His totals also ranked second in the league for goals and points. He has played in 104 career games with the Wilkes-Barre/Scranton Penguins between two seasons, registering 61 points (25G-36A). He has played three career games with Pittsburgh.

COMPETITION IN GOAL

The Penguins have some healthy competition in goal to start the season. **Tristan Jarry** will be featuring in his 11th season for Pittsburgh with **Joel Blomqvist**, **Sergei Murashov** and newcomer **Arturs Silovs** vying for gametime as well.

Jarry split the 2024-25 season between Pittsburgh and Wilkes-Barre/Scranton. In 36 with Pittsburgh, he had a record of 16-12-6 with a .893 save percentage and 3.12 GAA. He recorded two shutouts and those shutouts helped propel Jarry into third all-time in franchise history for career shutouts. He had a 6-5-1 record in 12 games in WBS with a .908 save percentage and 2.67 GAA. Over his 10 seasons with the Pittsburgh Penguins, he has a record of 152-97-31 in 293 career games and a save percentage of .909 and a 2.75 GAA.

Silovs split his 2024-25 season playing in 10 games with the Vancouver Canucks and in 21 games with the Abbotsford Canucks (AHL). He finished the season in Abbotsford with a 14-5-2 record and a goals-against average of 2.41. In the post-season he finished with a 16-7-0 record, registering a save percentage of .931 and five shutouts. He was named the AHL Playoffs MVP helping Abbotsford win the Calder Cup Championship. Over the course of his five seasons in the AHL, he has a record of 59-35-13. In his five seasons in the NHL, he has a career record of 8-8-2.

Blomqvist completed part of the 2024-25 season with Wilkes-Barre/Scranton and Pittsburgh. While in the AHL, he registered a .914 save percentage and 2.84 goals-against average with an 8-7-4 record in 18 games. He played in 15 games with a record of 4-9-1 with Pittsburgh. He had a .885 save percentage and a 3.81 GAA. Blomqvist spent parts of four seasons in Liiga, Finland's highest professional league, and had a 14-9-13 record in 45 games and had a .918 save percentage and a 1.92 GAA. He represented team Finland at both the World Under-18 Championship (2018-19) and World Under-20 Championship (2020-21).

Murashov completed his first season of professional hockey, splitting the 2024-25 season with the Wheeling Nailers (ECHL) and the Wilkes-Barre/Scranton Penguins. During his time in the AHL, he registered a .913 save percentage, 2.64 goals-against average, and a 12-3-0 record in 16 games. During his time in the ECHL, he registered a .922 save percentage, 2.40 goals-against average, and a 17-7-1 record in 26 games.

The 6-foot-2 netminder spent time in the Molodezhnaya Hokkeinaya Liga (MHL), a junior hockey league in Russia from 2020 to 2024, accumulating a .934 save percentage, 2.04 goals-against average, and a 73-30-12 record in 125 games. He also spent time in the Kontinental Hockey League (KHL), Russia's top professional league from 2021 to 2024. During this time, he accumulated a .928 save percentage, 1.71 goals-against average, and a 4-1-2 record in seven games.

FLEURY RETURNS TO PENGUINS ON PTO

The Pittsburgh Penguins have signed goaltender **Marc-Andre Fleury** to a professional tryout contract. He spent the 2024-25 season with the Minnesota Wild. Fleury, 40, will be suiting up to play in parts of Pittsburgh's exhibition game against Columbus on Saturday, September 27 at 7:00 PM at PPG Paints Arena.

The three-time Stanley Cup Champion (2009, '16, '17), all with Pittsburgh, enjoyed a 22-year career in the NHL from 2003-25 as a member of four clubs (Pittsburgh, Vegas, Chicago and Minnesota). Throughout his NHL tenure, Fleury played in 1,051 regular-season games with a 575-339-97 record and 76 shutouts. He has recorded 15 20-win seasons, nine 30-win seasons and two 40-win seasons, and only **Martin Brodeur** has more regular-season games

played and wins than Fleury in NHL history.

The Sorel, Quebec native has achieved many individual awards from the NHL for his play which includes four NHL All-Star Game selections [2011, '15, '18, '19], one Second-Team NHL All-Star selection [2021], one Vezina Trophy [2021] awarded to the goaltender who is adjudged to be the best at this position over the course of a season and one William M. Jennings Trophy [2021] awarded to the goaltender with the fewest goals scored against them during the regular season.

Fleury had his longest tenure with a club as a member of the Pittsburgh Penguins, where he spent 13 seasons from 2003-17. Fleury holds nearly every major goaltending record in Penguins history as his games played [691], wins [375] and shutout [44] totals all rank first in club history. Additionally, his 2.58 goals-against average is first, while his .912 save-percentage sits second among Penguins goaltenders with a minimum of 100 games played.

Playoff success followed for Fleury as his 115 games played, 62 wins and 10 shutouts all rank first in club history while his 2.65 goals-against average and .908 save percentage rank third and fourth, respectively.

Fleury was originally drafted by Pittsburgh in the first round [1st overall] of the 2003 NHL Draft. He is one of three goaltenders in NHL history to be taken first overall [**Rick DiPietro** – 2000, **Michel Plasse** – 1968].

PENGUINS ADD FIVE PLAYERS ON PTO's

Robby Fabbri, Jordan Kaplan, Cal Burke, Brett Murray and **Jake Livingstone** were signed to PTOs by the Penguins prior to the start of preseason.

Fabbri spent the 2024-25 season with the Anaheim Ducks where he scored 16 points [8G-8A] in 44 games. The 5-foot-11, 185-pound forward was sidelined by injury for the rest of the season.

The Mississauga, Ontario native has played in 442 career NHL games and tallied 216 points [106G-110A] across Anaheim, Detroit and St. Louis. Fabbri was drafted in the first-round [21st overall] by the St. Louis Blues in the 2014 NHL Draft. He won the Stanley Cup in 2019 with the Blues. The forward also won a gold medal with team Canada at the 2015 World Junior Championship.

Burke spent the 2024-25 season between the Vegas Golden Knights and the Henderson Silver Knights [AHL]. The 28-year-old played in 60 games and scored 19 points [10G-9A] in the AHL. He skated in seven games and scored one goal in Vegas.

The 5-foot-10, 183-pound forward has played parts of five seasons in the AHL, tallying 132 career points [56G-76A] in 277 games. Burke has played in 10 career NHL games and scored one goal.

The Boxborough, Massachusetts native played 146 career games with Notre Dame [NCAA] and scored 88 points [36G-52A]. He helped the Fighting Irish win back-to-back BIG 10 Championships in 2017-18 and '18-19. Burke also helped team USA win a bronze medal at the 2015-16 World Junior A Challenge.

Murray, a 27-year-old, split the 2024-25 season between Buffalo and the Rochester Americans. He skated in three games with the Sabres. In the AHL, he scored 27 goals and 22 assists for 49 points in 66 games. He also skated in eight playoff games with the Americans. He served as an alternate captain in Rochester.

He has played parts of four seasons with the Sabres and played in 26 games and scoring six points [2G-4A]. In the AHL, the 6-foot-5, 227-pound forward has scored 206 points [100G-106A] in 325 career games across parts of six seasons.

The Bolton, Ontario native was drafted 99th overall in the fourth round of the 2016 NHL Draft by the Buffalo Sabres. The forward earned the Canada Central Hockey League Top Prospect Award in 2015-16. He won the 2016-17 Big 10 Conference Championship with Penn State University. Murray scored a USHL league high 41 goals in 2018-19.

Livingstone, a 26-year-old defenseman, spent the 2024-25 campaign with the Milwaukee Admirals. He tallied 16 points [7G-9A] in 59 games. He tallied two assists in six Calder Cup playoff games.

The 6-foot-3, 205-pound defenseman has played parts two seasons in the AHL. He has played in 127 career games and scored nine goals and 24 assists for 33 points. In 2022-23, Livingstone played five games and recorded one assist with the Nashville Predators.

The Creston, British Columbia native scored 80 points [21G-59A] in 111 career games in the NCAA with Minnesota State University [Mankato]. He served as an alternate captain in 2022-23. Murray was named the Central Collegiate Hockey Association [CCHA] Defenseman of the Year in 2021-22 and '22-23. He was also named to the CCHA First All-Star Team in those same years. He helped the Mavericks to back-to-back CCHA regular season titles and conference championships in 2021-22 and '22-23.

Kaplan spent the 2024-25 season with the Worcester Railers in the ECHL. The Bridgewater, New Jersey native scored 49 points [18G-31A] in 68 games. All were professional career-highs.

The 5-foot-10, 170-pound forward has played 206 career ECHL games and scored 113 points [44G-69A]. Kaplan was named to the 2023-24 ECHL All-Star Game. He scored 58 points [26G-32A] in 116 career games in the NCAA.
