NED! NED! NED!

Alex Nedelikovic scored his first career NHL goal last night and became the fifth NHL goaltender in the last 10 years to light the lamp.

■ Last night marked Nedeljkovic's first career NHL goal, but the fourth professional goal of his career. He is the first goaltender to score a goal at the NHL, AHL and ECHL levels:

- In addition to his goal, Nedelikovic also recorded an assist last night to become the first goaltender in NHL history to have a goal and an assist in the same game.
- Nedeljkovic became the fourth goaltender in Penguins history to record two points in a game, and the first goalie in the NHL to do so since Pyotr Kochetkov did so on December 22, 2024 [2A].

- Nedeljkovic joins Tristan Jarry (Nov. 30, 2023) as the only goalies in Penguins history to score a goal. Pittsburgh is just the second team in NHL history to have multiple netminders with a goal, joining the Nashville Predators (Pekka Rinne on Jan. 9, 2020 and Chris Mason on Apr. 15, 2006).
- Nedelikovic also made 40 saves in the 5-2 win, marking the most he has made in a Penguins sweater (also 40 saves on Jan. 9, 2025 vs. EDM).

THE GRZELER

Matt Grzelcyk recorded his fourth multi-point game of the season last night in Buffalo with two helpers on the power play in the 5-2 win.

- Grzelcyk's two assists give him 23 on the season, marking a new career high, surpassing his previous high of 22 set in 2022-23.
- The defenseman's two assists on the power play increased his season total to eight points on the man advantage, which is also a new career high (previous career high was six power-play points in 2019-20 & '20-21).
- Grzelcyk now sits just two points away from tying his career-high point total of 26 set during the 2022-23 season with Boston.



POWERED UP

The Penguins' power play has been clicking as of late, scoring on the man advantage in nine of the last 12 games dating back to Dec. 23, going 15-for-38

■ Stretching back further, the Penguins have 23 power-play goals over their last 22 games dating back to Nov. 30. In that span, the Penguins' 23 powerplay goals lead the league and their 33.8 success rate ranks second:
