Two confirmed Texas Syndicate gang members arrested in major drug bust on IH 10

(Guadalupe County)
-- A pair of individuals are
behind bars after a routine
traffic stop led to a huge drug
bust.

Guadalupe County Sheriff's Officials say the incident began on Saturday when a deputy pulled over a small passenger vehicle for an equipment violation.

The stop was reported at 5 p.m. on IH 10 West near State Highway 46. Upon making contact with the vehicle, Deputy Israel Segura identified the two occupants as confirmed members of the Texas Syndicate, a known

prison gang with a history of criminal activity.

Following a probable cause search of the vehicle, authorities say they discovered a substantial quantity of illegal narcotics, including 260 grams of cocaine, 38 grams of heroin, 30 grams of methamphetamine, and various prescription drugs.

In addition, deputies seized a large sum of U.S. currency believed to be connected to drug trafficking.

Seguin ISD confirms experience of newly appointed interim superintendent

(Seguin) -- The Seguin ISD is sharing more behind its decision to appoint its current chief financial officer to the position of interim superintendent.

As reported earlier, district officials on Wednesday unanimously named its CFO Elizabeth "Liz" Banks, formerly Oaks to the position. Due to its superintendent search process timeline, Board President Denise Crettenden says Banks, thanks to her qualifications, will assume the position until the district names a new superintendent in July.

Banks joined the district as chief financial officer in April 2024. District officials say she has over a decade of experience in finance and operations, having served as chief financial officer for La Vernia ISD and Lamesa ISD, as well as having served as the business manager for Miami (TX) ISD. Prior to moving into finance, Banks also served two years in the classroom.

Banks is currently a registered Texas School Business Administrator (RTSBA), a member of the Texas Association of

School Officials (TASBO) and a member of the Texas Association of School Administrators (TASA).

Crettenden adds that Banks already has a great working relationship with the district's leadership staff and is confident that Banks can implement the support and guidance that is required to keep things up and

She states, "there are things happening every day and so I think she is going to be great at making sure those things are running smoothly and will just set us up for a great next school year."

District officials say many of Banks' responsibilities are in the operation of the district. This includes construction, transportation and of course, the budget.

The school board this past Saturday continued its superintendent search process by conducting its first round of interviews. The hope is to name a lone finalist by June 17.

Gary Job Corps in San Marcos among dozens set to close nationwide

(San Marcos) — The Gary Job Corps Center in neighboring San Marcos will close its doors this summer as part of a nationwide shutdown of contractor-operated Job Corps centers.

The U.S. Department of Labor announced this week it will pause operations at all such centers by June 30, 2025, citing poor outcomes, safety concerns, and growing financial deficits. The move impacts dozens of locations across the country, including Gary Job Corps — the closest center to Seguin, and one that has served thousands of South Central Texas students over the years.

Federal officials say the decision comes after a sweeping internal review that found the Job Corps program is no longer achieving the results intended when it was created to help young adults gain education and job training.

In its first-ever transparency report, the department revealed that the average graduation rate sits below 40 percent, while the average cost per graduate exceeds \$155,000.

Despite those costs, students earn just \$16,695 on average in their first year after leaving the program.

The report also highlighted safety issues, including more than 14,000 serious incidents in the last program year, with hundreds of cases involving violence, drug use, and sexual misconduct.

Labor Secretary Lori Chavez-DeRemer said the pause will allow for a re-evaluation of the program's structure and future. In the meantime, the department says it will work with local and state partners to help current students complete their training or transition to other education and employment opportunities.

Both individuals were taken into custody and charged with multiple felony offenses, including possession of controlled substances with intent to distribute and money laundering. They were booked into the Guadalupe County Adult Detention Facility, where they await arraignment.

The Guadalupe County Sheriff's Office has not yet released the names of the suspects at this time. The investigation is ongoing.

Seguin ISD stands by new SHS principal, says Muñoz passed all background checks

(Seguin) — Just days after the announcement of Albert Muñoz as the new principal of Seguin High School, the Seguin ISD is addressing concerns over a resurfaced online post connected to a legal matter from

The district released a statement this week confirming that it was made aware of a repost circulating on social media that referenced an incident involving Muñoz, then a coach at Clemens High School in the Schertz-Cibolo-Universal City ISD. The incident, which took place

nearly 11 years ago, reportedly involved Muñoz's arrest "for engaging in sexual activity with an adult woman in a van parked at Olmos Basin Park in San Antonio."

According to news reports at the time, Muñoz was taken into custody — but he was never formally charged with a crime. Officials added that the case "did not proceed with prosecution."

In a prepared statement to KWED, the Seguin ISD emphasized that Muñoz passed both state and federal background checks - a standard



requirement it says is for all district hires.

"Seguin ISD has learned about a recent repost of 10-year-old information regarding one of our recent hires. We want to be clear about our process during hiring: this person passed a rigorous state and federal background check, as do all new hires in Seguin ISD. In an abundance of caution, when these reposts were brought to our attention, we took additional time to review the legal record again, and no record was found. Given that, all evidence indicates that the matter was closed without

being pursued further."

District officials have highlighted his two decades of experience in education, most recently as associate principal at John Jay High School in San Antonio. He has also worked at Stevens and O'Connor high schools in the Northside ISD, and previously in the Dilley ISD.


Muñoz's appointment, as Seguin High School principal, was recently approved by the Seguin ISD Board of Trustees. His first day on the job is June 2.





CDC Says New COVID Strain From China Has Arrived In U.S.

(Atlanta, GA) -- The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention says a new COVID-19 strain, responsible for a large surge in China, has arrived in the U.S. It's an Omicron variant known as NB181 and has been detected through airport screening programs for international travelers. The first cases here showed up here in late March and early April producing symptoms similar to earlier COVID strains. The CDC says a handful of cases have been confirmed in New York, California, Rhode Island, Virginia, Ohio, Washington and Hawaii.

RFK Blocking Government Scientist From Publishing In Journals

(Undated) -- Health and Human Services Secretary Robert F. Kennedy Jr. is considering a move to ban government scientists from publishing in leading medical journals. During a podcast appearance, Kennedy Jr. said Lancet, the New England Journal of Medicine, JAMA and other journals "are all corrupt." Although the publications are consistently ranked as the top medical journals in the world, Kennedy alleged they are "vessels" for pharmaceutical companies. Kennedy is proposing for agencies within HHS to create their own "inhouse" journals that will become the preeminent journals in their field.

Study: U.S. Moms Are Struggling With Mental Health

(New York, NY) -- A new study says three-fourths of all moms in the U.S. are struggling with some degree of mental health issues. The study published Tuesday by Columbia University looked at nearly 200-thousand mothers over a seven-year period, and found only 25 percent reporting "excellent" mental health. That's down from 38 percent in 2016. The study also showed declines in physical health among U.S. mothers, especially among those who were single, younger, less educated and whose children were multi-racial or uninsured.

New Ultrasound Tool to Treat Liver Cancer Gaining Popularity

(Grand Rapids, MI) -- Michigan-based Corewell Health is now using a cutting-edge ultrasound device to treat certain liver cancers, and early results are promising. The technology, developed by HistoSonics out of the University of Michigan, uses focused sound waves to destroy tumors without harming nearby tissue. Approved by the FDA last year, it's currently cleared for liver cancer but could expand to other organs like the kidney and pancreas. Doctors say the treatment is non-invasive, highly precise, and well tolerated by patients. Corewell is one of just 30 hospitals nationwide offering the procedure.




