Color Our World with Stories: Summer Reading Begins at Seguin Public Library

(Seguin) -- Who says summer adventures only happen at the beach?

This year, the hottest destination and the best place to keep cool is the Seguin Public Library.

The Seguin Public Library is inviting the community to unleash their creativity this summer through its 2025 Summer Reading Experience, a season-long celebration of art, imagination, and the joy of reading.

With the theme "Color Our World," this year's program will inspire participants to explore how creativity and artistic expression enrich daily life. That's according to Betsey Leitko, the library's youth services manager.

"Our theme for this year is 'Color Our World.' So, it's just really encouraging everyone to just explore the world, explore art and see how it can enrich your lives. It's just a way to encourage people to come to the library and learn something new all summer long especially for our kiddos while they are out of school -- keeping them exercising that brain until schools start up again in August," said Leitko.

Leitko says the library will be more than just books. She says it will offer a number of fun weekly programs and activities beginning this Saturday.

"We will have some really fun programs going on. We are going to kick off on Saturday, June 7 at 10 a.m. with a foam party. It's going to be out in the parking lot. We will have Big Time Bubbles coming out with their big foam cannon and so we will have music, we will have foam. It will be lots of fun," said Leitko.

Guadalupe County residents invited to weigh in on \$256 million in transportation projects

(Seguin) -- Local residents this Thursday will be given a chance to help shape the future of local transportation right here in Guadalupe Couanty.

The Alamo Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (AAMPO) will be seeking public feedback on proposed infrastructure projects. These projects will all be competing for a share of \$256 million in regional funding. AAMPO will host a public meeting this Thursday at 6 p.m. at the Seguin Public Library.

spokesperson AAMPO Garza-White says the proposed improvements aim to support growth, increase mobility, and enhance safety throughout Guadalupe County.

"We will be bringing 49 projects that are proposed to be a part of our transportation improvement plan which is our short-range plan and they are all transportation projects and then they will have the opportunity to comment and rank their top 3 projects," said Garza-White.

Of those 49 projects, Garza-White says seven of those are being proposed for Guadalupe County.

After this weekend, Leitko says families are encouraged to mark their calendars on Thursdays for a host of other scheduled events.

Weekly events include performers such as Austin Reptile Shows, Master Juggler Matt Tardy, Sock Monkey Circus and more. Children's events will be every Thursday and registration will be required.

Teens, ages 12 to 17, will also have plenty to look forward to. Signature events include an Interactive Movie on June 21 at 2 p.m. and Paint Night on July 11 at 5:30 p.m. Additionally, Teen Tuesday will return each week from 4:30 to 5:30 p.m., offering activities like video gaming, drawing, and creative workshops. A teen art and writing competition will also give participants a chance to win prizes and have their work displayed at the library.

Like children and teens, Leitko says adults are also invited in for some fun. She says the summer will feature a variety of interactive events such as an Escape Room, Murder Mystery Party, Jigsaw Puzzle Competition plus Comedy Night, and many other fun activities.

"Adults, they also have a reading component and so when they read, they get the chance to win some really awesome prizes that we have but we also have some great programs for them to come and participate in. We have a book club. We have tai chi. We have a coloring club. We have an adult social hour which our adult services librarian always plans some really fun activities during that program," said Leitko.

To make sure they are completely in the loop of all things summer, Leitko encourages participants to register, pickup up an activity board and complete the tasks on that board for a chance to take home some very special raffle prizes.

"They just need to come to the library. They can register in person, or they can call us or email us to register as well. You don't have to have a library card to participate in any of these activities whether it's the reading portion of the program or to come to any of the events that we have going on," said Leitko.

Again, a library card is not required to participate. Participants have until August 7 to complete their activity boards and be entered into a drawing for prizes.

The Seguin Public Library is located at 313 W. Nolte St.

The projects seeking public input include:

- US 90 and State Highway 46 Sidewalks and Shared-Use Path (SUP): A 12-foot-wide shared-use path is planned along SH 46 from B and B Road to US 90 in Seguin. Additional 6-foot sidewalks are proposed on US 90 and US 90 Alternate, with a vital pedestrian connection through Seguin ISD property.
- Martindale Road Expansion: Plans call for added travel lanes, a raised median, and concrete sidewalks from FM 20 south to Twin Oak Road.
- Citywide Pedestrian 2028 Initiative: This project would install new 6-foot sidewalks and 10-foot shared-use paths in multiple locations throughout the city, including ADA ramps and safer intersection crossings.
- Strempel Road Extension: A four-lane roadway extension is proposed from Rudeloff Road to N. Austin Street, with a 12-foot shared-use path and raised median to improve both vehicle flow and non-motorized access.
- SH 123 Widening: This project proposes expanding the highway to four lanes with a raised median and turn lanes to ease congestion and

improve safety.

- IH-10 Enhancements: A westbound frontage road would be constructed between SH 123 and Geronimo Creek, along with ramp revisions for improved traffic management.
- FM 3009 Realignment: The project includes a grade separation at the Union Pacific Railroad/ FM 78 intersection, with accommodations for both pedestrians and cyclists.

Garza-White says public feedback is a critical part in selecting these projects for funding and encourages residents to take part in Thursday's public meeting.

"It plays a very big part. Public input is not only federally required but we think it's very important to get the public's opinion on our transportation projects what the public's priorities are? The public often brings to attention really important points that aren't really considered otherwise so it's very important that we have these meetings with us. As the decision is made about these projects, public input is taken into account as something that is a big deal," said Garza-White.

Residents unable to attend the Seguin meeting can still participate by submitting comments online from now through June 30, at alamoareampo.org/yourmove.

The website also provides project maps, detailed proposals, and more information about the planning process.



Salmonella Outbreak In Cucumbers Expanded To 18 States

(Washington, DC) -- A salmonella outbreak in cucumbers has expanded to include 45 people reporting illness in 18 states. Target has been added to the list of retailers that sold recalled cucumbers or ready-to-eat products with the fruit and is warning consumers to throw them in the trash. Target released a list of recalled products, including a Greek-style chicken salad from Boar's Head and several types of sushi sold under the Mai brand. The FDA said 16 of the 45 people who have reported illness have been hospitalized. The agency said all the illnesses have been linked to cucumbers produced by Bedner Growers and distributed by Fresh Start Produce Sales.

Exercise Linked To Lower Rates Of Returning Cancer

(Undated) -- Exercise could reduce the risk of colon cancer making a comeback. A new study found that people who had recovered from colon cancer that developed a personal exercise program were 90 percent cancer free after eight years. Patients without an exercise program were 83 percent cancer free. The findings were published Sunday in the New England Journal of Medicine.

FDA Updates Recall Of Tomatoes

(Washington, DC) -- The Food and Drug Administration is updating a tomato recall in three southeastern states. The agency says there is a higher possibility that potential salmonella contamination could lead to "serious adverse health consequences or death." The FDA said that the recalled batch is no longer in stores, but the bacteria can survive for weeks in dry environments and for months if frozen. The tomatoes were sold in packages as small as three a pack to as large as 25 pounds. They were distributed between April 23rd and 28th to Georgia, North Carolina and South Carolina under the H&C Farms label.

Hundreds Of CVS Store Closures

(Woonsocket, RI) -- Hundreds of CVS pharmacies are closing this year. The national drug store chain confirmed the closure of 270 stores as part of an ongoing effort to "realign" the company's retail footprint. News of the closures were first announced in October of 2024. The company also said it planned to open nearly 30 CVS Pharmacy locations this year and it previously shared plans to open "smaller format" stores in select communities.






