

Key Messages

- → Multiple rounds of showers and thunderstorms starting tonight and persisting throughout the weekend.
- \rightarrow Severe weather is likely (>80% chance), particularly in the afternoons and evenings of Friday, Saturday, and potentially Sunday.
- \rightarrow All severe weather hazards will be possible.
- → Flooding concerns will be present due to the possibility of recurrent thunderstorms.

Severe Weather Potential - Today


Key Points



Severe Weather Potential - Friday


Key Points


→ A second round of thunderstorms will develop Friday afternoon and continue into Friday night. Severe weather is likely (>80% chance), including the potential for hail up to 3" in diameter, strong tornadoes, and wind gusts of 70 mph.



Severe Weather Potential - Saturday


Key Points

→ A third round of thunderstorms will develop Saturday afternoon or evening and continue into Saturday night. Severe weather is again likely (>70% chance), including the potential for hail up to 3" in diameter, a few tornadoes, and wind gusts of 70 mph.





Severe Weather Potential - Sunday


Key Points


