

Winter Weather this Weekend

For Portions of Southeast Nebraska & Southwest Iowa

Important Forecast Changes

- → New Blizzard Warning in effect beginning 3 AM Sunday through 12 AM Monday for Jefferson, Gage, Pawnee & Richardson Counties in Nebraska.
 - Wind gusts 35 to 40 mph and visibility below ¼ mile will make for dangerous driving conditions

Key Messages


- → A Winter Weather Advisory will be in effect from this afternoon through 6 PM Sunday. A Winter Storm Warning will be in effect through Sunday night. A Blizzard Warning will be in effect through Sunday night.
- → Much of southeast Nebraska & southwest Iowa are expected to receive snow, with totals decreasing as you progress northward.
- → 6 to 12" snow in the Winter Storm/Blizzard Warning areas, with light glaze of freezing drizzle before snow begins




Latest Snow Forecast - Sharp Cutoff Expected

Discussion & Important Points

This is the most likely forecast as of 4 PM this morning. In reality, there is a larger range of potential outcomes than shown on this map. Check back for updates!

- → Very sharp cutoff in snow amounts from north to south.
- → In some areas, it may vary from 1" to 6" over less than 50 miles!
- → Any small northward or southward shift in the storm track may greatly influence the total snow amount at your location.



- → Freezing drizzle is not a guarantee, but something to keep in mind if traveling

Another Round of Snow This Weekend

What

Winter Storm Severity Index graphic highlights the areas that can expect the most significant and long-lasting impacts.

Timing

A brief period of freezing drizzle is possible this evening, quickly transitioning to snow. The heaviest snow will occur late Sunday morning through Sunday afternoon. Blizzard conditions will begin overnight across southeast Nebraska and southwest Iowa.



Max Wind Gusts Sunday

Key Messages


- → Winds will increase out of the north/northeast at 15 to 25 mph Sunday morning and afternoon.
- → Gusts up to 25 to 40 mph will be possible throughout the day Sunday.
- → Blizzard conditions are expected in the area outlined by a red dash. Elsewhere, reduced visibilities in blowing snow combined with snow drifting over roadways could make travel very hazardous at times.







Very Cold Wind Chills Expected

Coldest Values Expected Monday Morning









- Wind Chills could drop to -0° to -22° each morning next week.
- Extreme cold advisories could eventually be needed for portions of northeast Nebraska Monday morning.
