

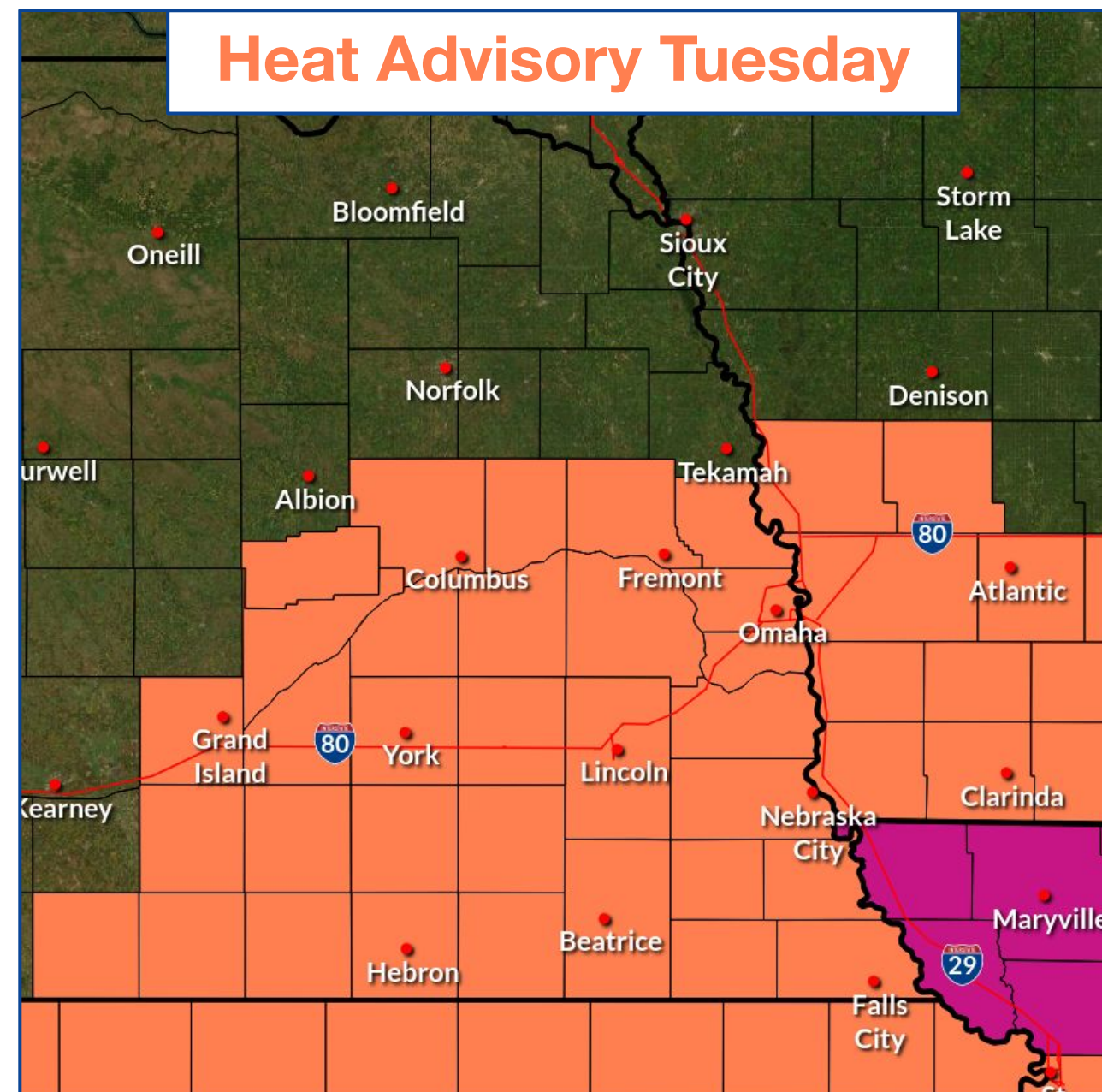


Dangerous Heat, Severe Storm Potential

July 29, 2025
6:57 AM

Key Messages:

- Dangerous heat continues through Tuesday. A Heat Advisory has been issued for noon through 8 pm Tuesday.
- Another round of strong to severe thunderstorms is possible late this afternoon and evening.
 - Heavy rainfall and damaging wind will be the main hazards.





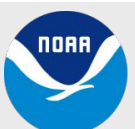
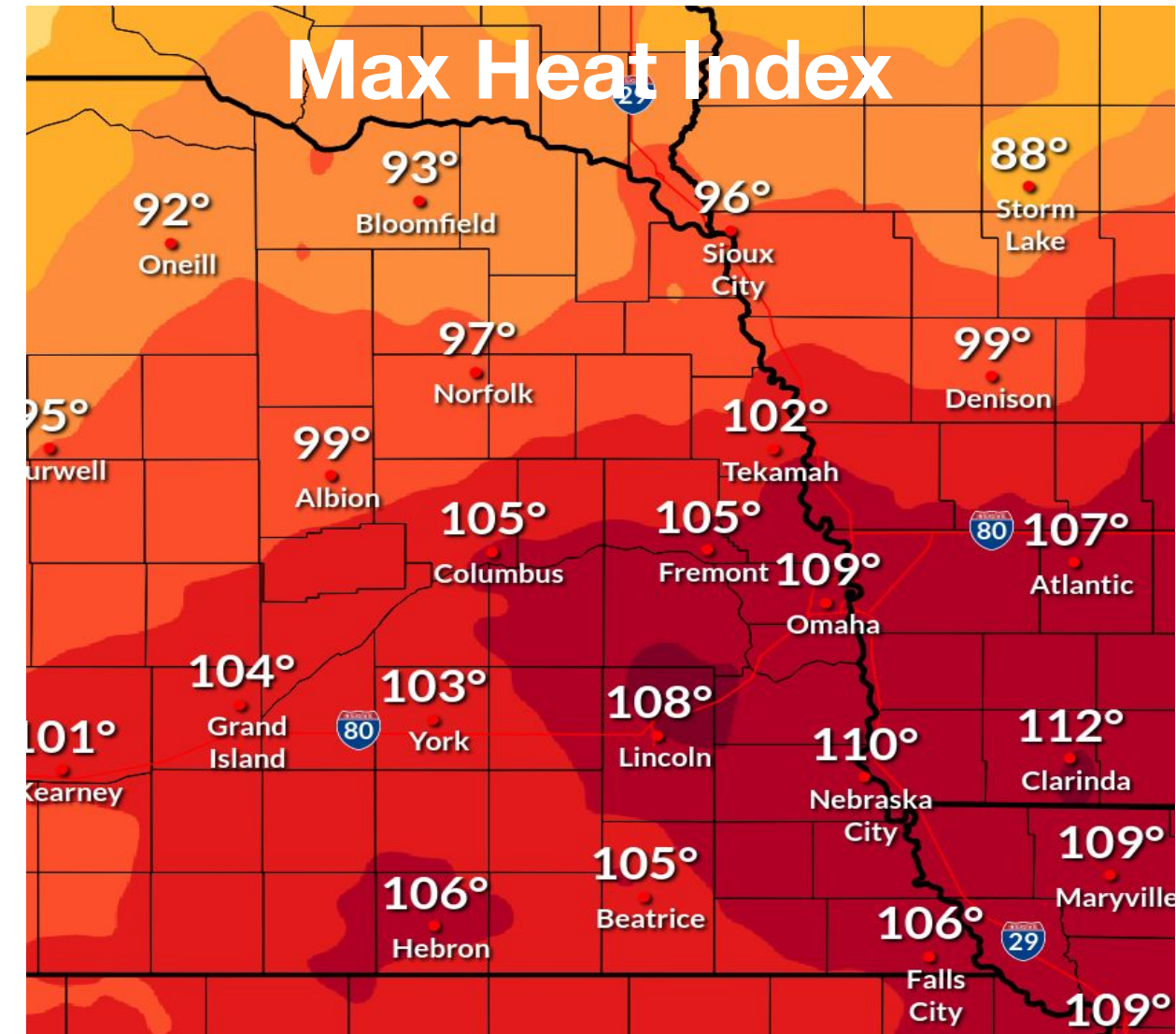
Maximum Heat Index

Additional Information:

- A slightly cooler air mass will arrive in northeast Nebraska Tuesday, limiting the heat
- **Heat Advisory** Tuesday for much of eastern Nebraska and southwest Iowa from noon to 8 pm.
 - Uncertainty exists on how far south the cool-down will reach.

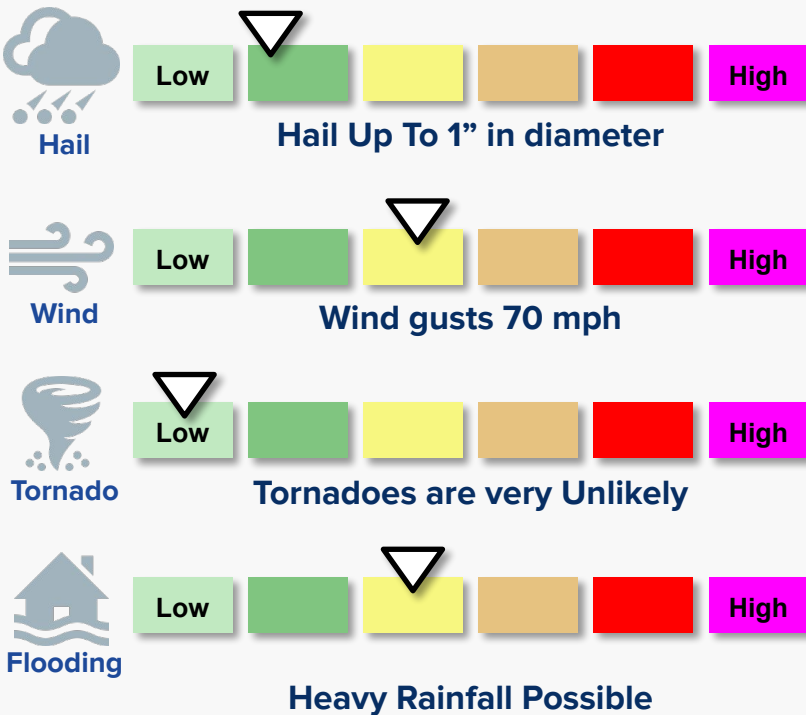
Heavy Rain and Strong Winds are Most Likely

Threat Assessment

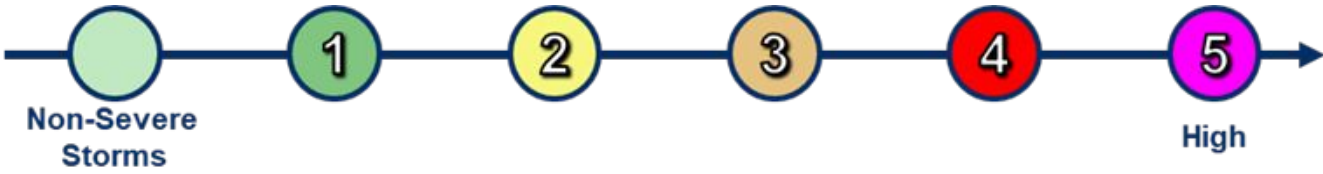
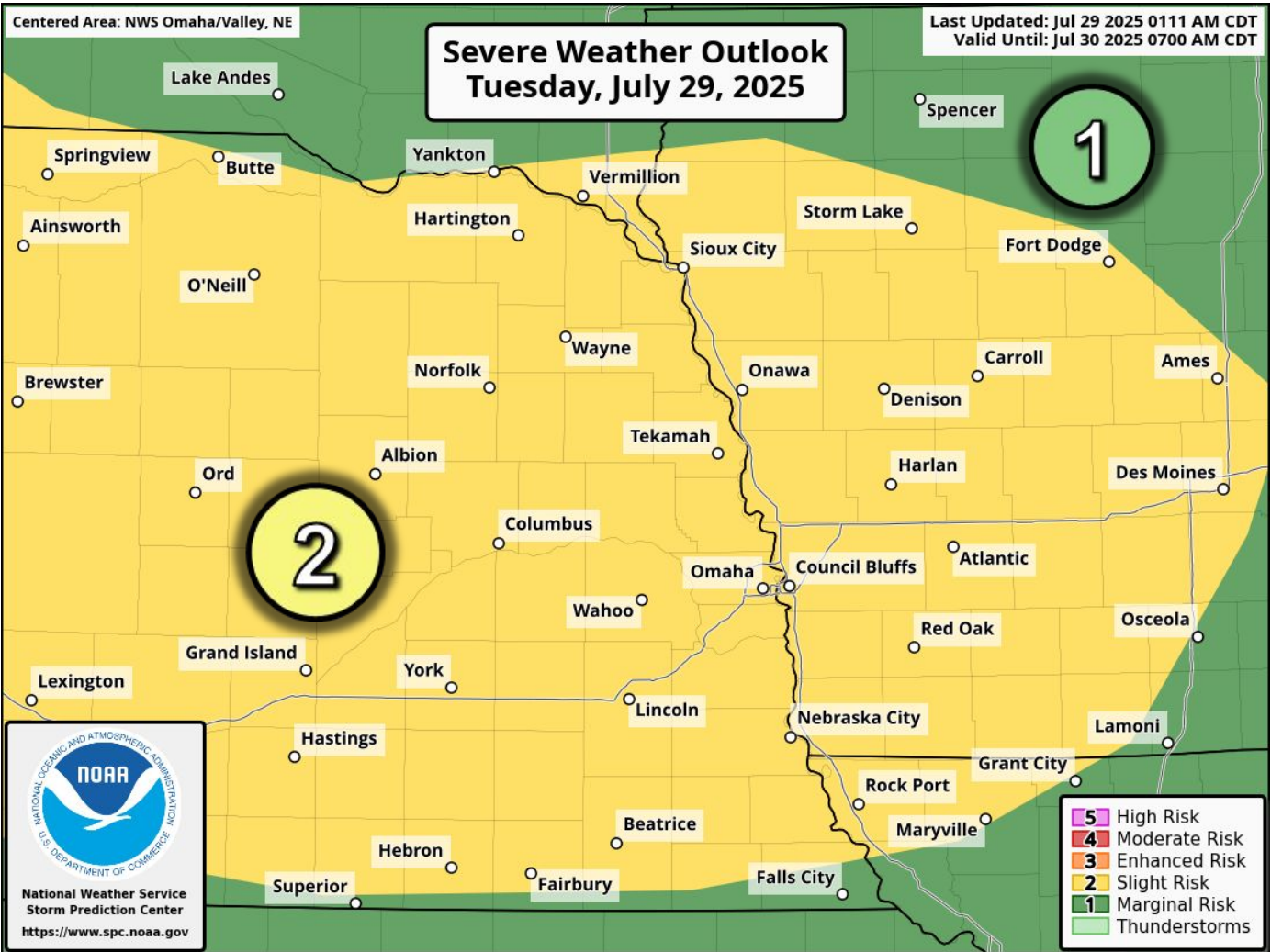
HIGHEST LOCAL RISK

What to Know

- There is a 80% chance of storms and a **25% chance of severe storms** across the area.
- Storms may train over the same location, bringing a localized flooding threat.

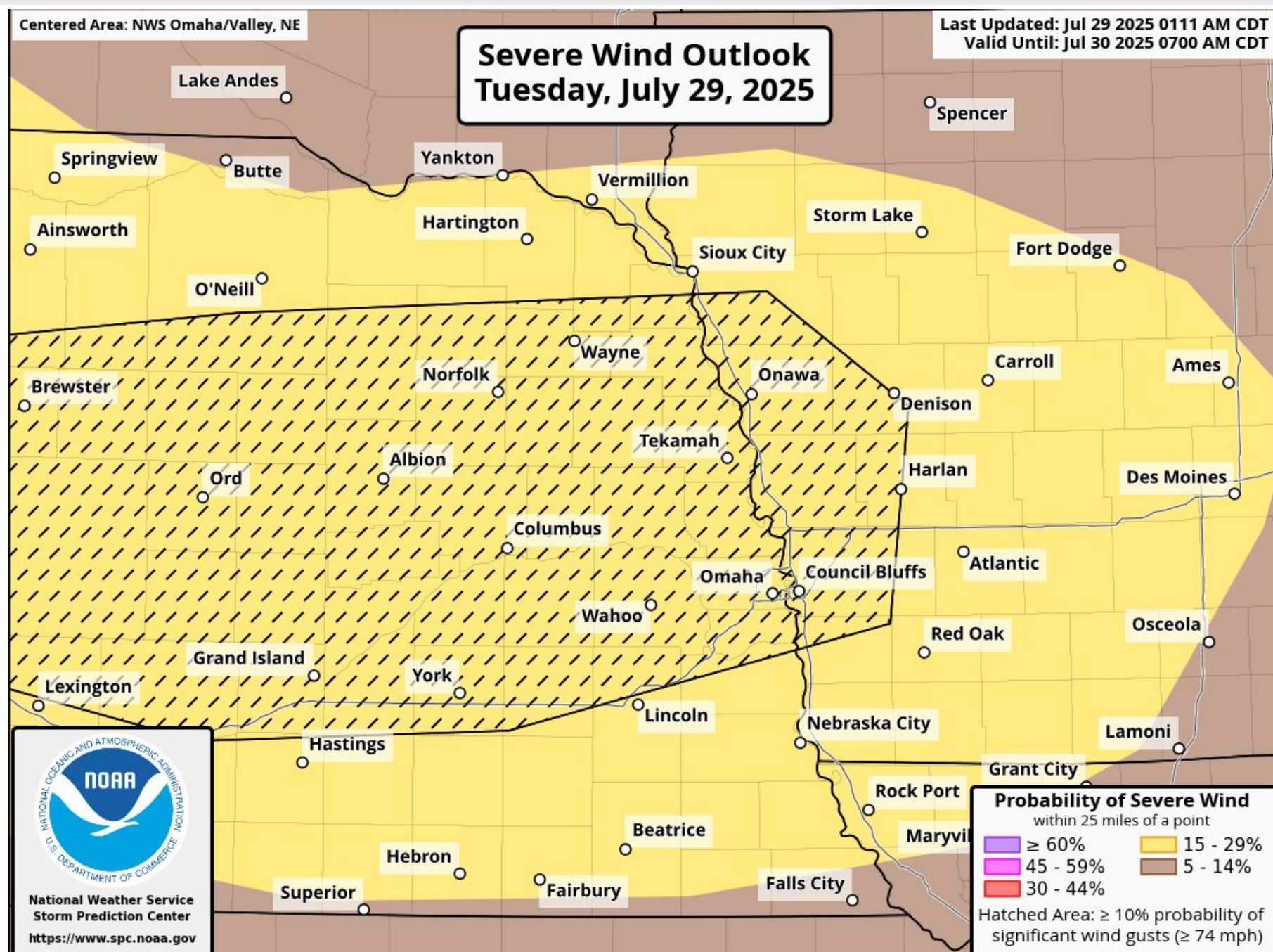
Heightened Risk for Strong Damaging Winds

Additional Information:

- There is an increased threat for strong, damaging winds with this evening's storms.

Yellow Area: probability of damaging thunderstorm winds or wind gusts of 50 knots or higher within 25 miles of a point.

Black Hatched Area: 10% or greater probability of wind gusts 65 knots or greater within 25 miles of a point.





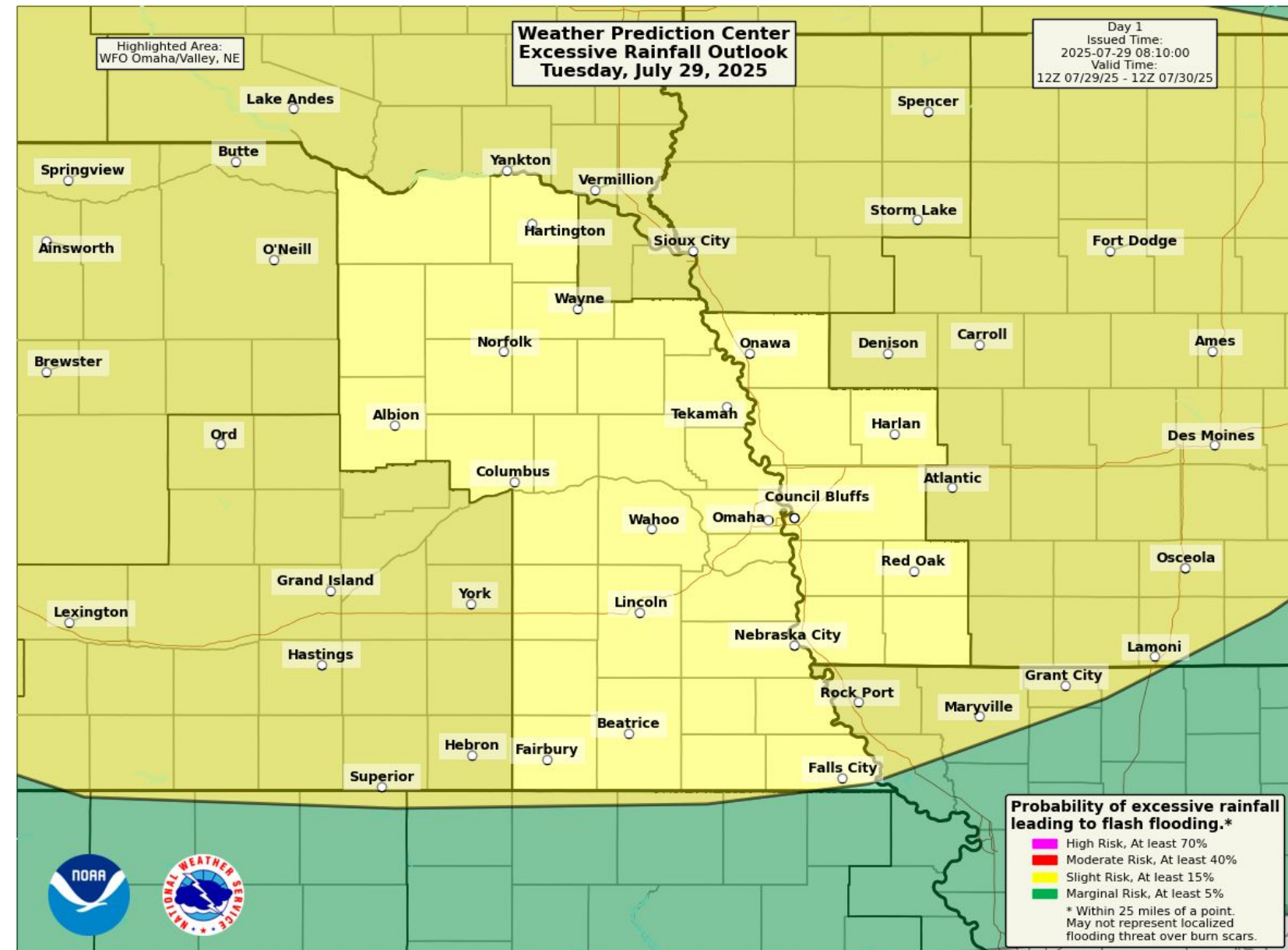
Excessive Rainfall Outlook

July 29, 2025

Storms may bring heavy rainfall to the area on Tuesday

Additional Information:

- Showers and storms develop along a frontal boundary in the late afternoon.
- Conditions appear favorable for heavy rainfall across much of the area.
 - Training storms could lead to areas of localized flooding

HEAT
EXHAUSTION

Faint or dizzy

Excessive sweating

Cool, pale, clammy skin

Nausea or vomiting

Rapid, weak pulse

Muscle cramps

OR

HEAT
STROKE

Throbbing headache, confusion

No sweating

Body temperature above 103°
Red, hot, dry skin

Nausea or vomiting

Rapid, strong pulse

May lose consciousness

• Get to a cooler, air conditioned place

• Drink water if fully conscious

• Take a cool shower or use cold compresses

CALL 9-1-1

• Move person to cooler place

• Cool using cool cloths or bath

• Do not give anything to drink
