**4.25.** That's the width of a cup in inches.






- **13.351769.** That's the circumference of a cup in inches. Lots of room for a golf ball!

The lineal footage of blades on these seven pieces of equipment is 266 feet. This takes into account the number of blades on each individual reel. As an example one real may have eleven blades at 21" long resulting in 231" of blades on that particular cutting head."
