## **Calumet High School Athletic Hall of Fame - Class of 2025**

Calumet High School is excited to announce that it will induct the Class of 2025 into the Calumet High School Athletic Hall of Fame on Saturday, September 20, 2025. The event will start at 11:00am with a coffee social in the CLK Schools Commons. The hall of fame induction ceremony is free of charge and open to the public.

TeriLynne Budreau Johnston - Earned 9 letters in Volleyball (3), Basketball (3) Track (2), and Golf (1) while attending Calumet High School from 2011-2015. In volleyball, she was named WestPAC All-Conference 1st Team as a junior and as a senior (2013, 2014). TeriLynne was named to the Michigan Interscholastic Volleyball Coaches Association (MIVCA) All-Region Team as a junior and senior (2013, 2014). She was named All-State Honorable Mention by MIVCA as a senior (2014). She helped lead her team to three consecutive WestPAC, MHSAA District, and MHSAA Regional Championships (2012, 2013, 2014), serving as a team captain as a senior. TeriLynne set the school record for most assists in a career with 2,069. This record stood for 9 years. In basketball, she helped lead her team to the MHSAA Class C State Championship as a senior, defeating Flint Hamady 57-49 (2015), where she finished with 12 rebounds, including six in the 4th quarter. TeriLynne played three seasons of collegiate volleyball and earned three varsity letters at Viterbo University (2015-2018). She was named to the Viterbo Dean's List all four years (2015-2019.) TeriLynne received Midwest Collegiate Conference academic honors (2015) and North Star Athletic Association academic honors (2016-2018). She helped lead her team to three conference championships (2015, 2016, 2017). TeriLynne helped lead her team to a National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) Final Four appearance as a freshman (2015), Elite 8 appearance as a sophomore (2016), and Final Four appearance as a junior (2017). She coached club volleyball with the VHawk Xtreme (2015-2018) and served as a varsity assistant coach with Onalaska High School (WI) for two seasons (2017, 2018).

Chelsea Jacques - Earned 5 letters in Track (4), and Cross Country (1) while attending Calumet High School from 2011-2015 and graduating as class valedictorian. In cross county she earned All-Conference 1st Team, WestPAC Runner of the Year honors, and was named to the All-UP and All-State teams as a junior (2014). In track, Chelsea was named WestPAC Sprinter of the Year in 2013 and 2014, and WestPAC Overall MVP three years in a row (2013, 2014, 2015). In 2012, she placed 1st in the 100M and 200M dash and placed 3rd in the 400M relay at the UP Finals. In 2013, she placed 1st in the 100M dash, 200M dash, and 400M relay at the UP Finals. In 2014, she placed 1st in the 100M dash, 200M dash, 2nd in the 400M relay, and 5th in the 800M relay at the UP Finals. In 2015, she placed 1st in the 100M dash, 200M dash, 400M relay, and long jump at the UP Finals becoming a rare four-event champion in a single meet and capping a stellar track career as an 11-time UP Champion. Chelsea set the school record in the 100M dash with a time of 12:46 (2012). This record stands at the time of induction. She set the MHSAA Division 1 UP Finals record in the 100M dash with a time of 12.55 (2012). This record stands at the time of induction. Chelsea set the school record in the 400M relay with a time of 51.87 (2014). This record stands at the time of induction. In hockey, she captained the Keweenaw Storm U19 team that won four consecutive MAHA State Championships between 2011-2014 and finished as USA Hockey National Runner-Up three times (2011, 2013, 2014). Chelsea played one season of Midget AAA hockey with the Madison Capitals serving as an alternate captain. She was recruited to play Division 1 college hockey at Colgate in the Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference (ECAC) where she played in 130 career games as a defenseman where she scored 2 goals and added 11 assists for 13 points and recorded 75 blocked shots (2015-2019). She was a four-time ECAC Hockey All-Academic Team honoree, three-time Raider Academic Honor Roll student, AHCA All-American Scholar (2016-17), and the team's Most Improved Player (2015-16). During her junior season, Colgate won the ECAC Regular Season Championship, and lost to

Clarkson in the NCAA Division 1 Championship game in overtime 2-1, finishing as the NCAA National Runner-Up with a record of 34-6-1.

Tara Kiilunen Aho - Earned 7 letters in Cross County (4), and Track (3) while attending Calumet High School from 2009-2013. In cross country she was named WestPAC All-Conference 1st Team, WestPAC Runner of the Year, and All-UP Dream Team as a freshman (2009). She placed 1st individually at the MHSAA UP Cross Country Finals (19:36.1) and led her team to the MHSAA UP Championship (2009). Tara was named WestPAC All-Conference 1st Team, WestPAC Runner of the Year, All-UP Dream Team, UP Runner of the Year, and All-State as a sophomore (2010). She placed 1st individually at the MHSAA UP Cross Country Finals (18:37.0) and led her team to the MHSAA UP Championship (2010). Tara was named WestPAC All-Conference 1st Team, WestPAC Runner of the Year, All-UP Dream Team, UP Runner of the Year, and All-State as a junior (2011). She placed 1st individually at the MHSAA UP Cross Country Finals (19:12.6) and led her team to a third place finish at the UP Finals (2011). Tara was named WestPAC All-Conference 1st Team, WestPAC Runner of the Year, All-UP Dream Team, UP Runner of the Year, and All-State as a senior (2012). She placed 1st individually for the fourth consecutive year at the MHSAA UP Cross Country Finals (19:44.7) becoming only the second UP female athlete to do so and led her team to their 3rd MHSAA UP Championship during her career (2012). Tara set the school cross county record with her 1st place finish at the Calumet Golf Course with a time of 19:04.0 (2010). This record stands at the time of induction. In track, she set school records in the 800M run with a time of 2:25.05 (2010), 3200M relay with a time of 9:47.56 (2010) and the 3200M run with a time of 11:50.7 (2012). These records stand at the time of induction. In 2010, Tara placed 1st in the 1600M run and 3200M relay and finished 2nd in the 800M run and 3200M run at the MHSAA UP Finals. In 2011, she placed 1st in the 3200M run and 800M run and finished 2nd in the 3200M relay at the MHSAA UP Finals. In 2012, Tara placed 1st in the 3200M run, 2nd in the 3200 relay, and 3rd place in the 800M run at the MHSAA UP Finals. She finished her track career as a five-time UP Champion and earned All-State honors 10 times. She later coached cross country at Washington Middle School and Calumet High School.

Sheila Peterson Marin - Earned 11 letters in Basketball (3), Track (4), and Swim and Dive (4) while attending Calumet High School from 1996-2000. In basketball, she was named All-Conference Honorable Mention as a junior (1998). Sheila was named to the All-Conference 1st Team and All-UP Special Mention as a senior (1999). She set the school record for Most Steals in a Season with 112 (1999). This record stood for 25 years before being broken in 2024. She set the school record for Most Assists in a Season with 149 (1999). This record stands at the time of induction. Sheila set the school record for Most Steals in a Career with 250 (1997-1999). This record stands at the time of induction. In track, she was a five-time All-State recipient by placing 2nd in the 100M hurdles, 4th in the 300M hurdles, 5th in the 400M relay (1998), and 5th in the 100M hurdles and long jump (2000) at the MHSAA UP Track Finals. In swim and dive (co-op with Houghton), she placed 1st in the one-meter dive at the UP Finals while helping her team to a 2nd place finish as a freshman (1997). Sheila placed 2nd at the UP Finals in the one-meter dive as a sophomore and helped her team to an MHSAA UP Championship (1998). She placed 2nd at the UP Finals in the one-meter dive as a junior and helped her team to an MHSAA UP Championship (1999). Sheila placed 1st at the UP Finals in the

one-meter dive as a senior and helped her team to a third-straight MHSAA UP Championship (2000). She was named to the All-UP Swim and Dive Team in 1997, 1998, 1999, and 2000. Sheila set a Houghton/Calumet High School record for diving with 256.10 points. This is also the MHSAA UP Finals Dive record (2000). These records both stand at the time of induction.

She received the CHS Senior Female Athlete Award, now the Holly Jean McCullah Award, as the outstanding senior female athlete (2000). Sheila went on to play college basketball with St. Scholastica (2000-2002) and Northland College (2004-2005).

Lexie Rowe Jacques - Earned 10 letters in Volleyball (3), Basketball (3), Track (3), and Golf (1) while attending Calumet High School from 2011-2015. In volleyball, she was named to the WestPAC All-Conference 2nd Team as a sophomore (2012). Lexie was named WestPAC Conference Player of the Year as a Junior and Senior (2013, 2014). She was named to the Michigan Interscholastic Volleyball Coaches Association (MIVCA) All-Region Team as a Junior and Senior (2013, 2014). Lexie was named All-State Honorable Mention by MIVCA as a Junior and Senior (2013, 2014). She helped lead her team to three consecutive WestPAC, MHSAA District, and MHSAA Regional Championships (2012, 2013, 2014), serving as a team captain as a junior and senior. In basketball, Lexie was named WestPAC All-Conference 1st Team as a sophomore, junior, and senior (2013, 2014, 2015). She was named All-State Honorable Mention by the Basketball Coaches Association of Michigan (BCAM) as a junior (2014). Lexie was named All-UP Class ABC 1st Team as a sophomore and junior (2013, 2014). She was named All-UP Dream Team as a senior (2015). Lexie helped lead her team to the MHSAA Class C State Championship as a senior, defeating Flint Hamady 57-49 (2015), where she scored 22 points, including four 3-pointers in the 1st half. She was named to the Detroit Free Press All-Tournament Dream Team, BCAM's Best All-State Team, and Detroit Free Press All-State Class C 2nd Team (2015). She served as a team captain as a junior and senior. Lexie represented the Western UP in the Border Bash game in Ironwood, and the UP All-Star Basketball Game in Marquette representing the Northern schools (2015). In track, Lexie earned All-State honors four times based on results at the MHSAA UP Finals: 400M Relay 3rd Place (2012), 400M Relay 1st Place (2013), 400 M Relay 2nd Place (2014), 800 M Relay 5th Place (2014). She set the school record in the 400M relay with a time of 51.87 (2014). This record stands at the time of induction. Lexie received the Holly Jean McCullah Award, as the outstanding senior female athlete (2015). She went on to play two seasons of basketball at Lake Superior State University (GLIAC) from 2015-2017, appearing in 36 games and scoring 69 points. Lexie also coached freshman volleyball and JV basketball at CHS.

**Ellen Twardzik Hall** - Earned 10 letters in Volleyball (4), Basketball (4), and Softball (2) while attending Calumet High School from 2011-2015. In volleyball, she was named WestPAC All-Conference Honorable Mention as a freshman (2011). Ellen was named WestPAC All-Conference 1st Team as a sophomore (2012). She was named WestPAC All-Conference 1st Team as a senior (2014). Ellen was named to the Michigan Interscholastic Volleyball Coaches Association (MIVCA) All-Region Team as a Junior and Senior (2013, 2014). She helped lead her team to three consecutive WestPAC, MHSAA District, and MHSAA Regional Championships (2012, 2013, 2014), serving as a team captain as a junior and senior. In basketball, Ellen was named WestPAC All-Conference Honorable Mention as a junior (2014). She was named WestPAC All-Conference 1st Team as a

senior (2015). Ellen was named All-UP Class ABC 2nd Team as a senior (2015). She overcame two season-ending knee injuries in high school to help lead her team to the MHSAA Class C State Championship as a senior, defeating Flint Hamady 57-49 (2015), where she pulled down 11 rebounds in the championship game, including 8 in the first half. Ellen served as a team captain as a junior and senior. She represented the Western UP in the Border Bash game in Ironwood, and the UP All-Star Basketball Game in Marquette representing the Northern schools (2015). In softball, Ellen earned WestPAC All-Conference 2nd Team honors as a junior (2014). Ellen went on to play collegiate basketball at Mid-Michigan Community College for two seasons (2015-2017), finishing 5th at the national tournament (2016).
